

## **Regional suggestions: East Asia and South-East Asia Group**

1. Item L: Developing countries must be provided adequate support in financial and technical, compensating mechanisms on: Improvement of livelihoods; capacity building; technology transfer.
2. Non-debt creating mechanisms and compensating mechanisms for poor countries.
3. Add to declaration: Documentation of gender responsive best practices related to climate change must be institutionalized for sharing and replication.
4. To urge rich countries to set up immediately a mitigation and adaptation fund available for developing country governments as well as NGOs, and to be managed by a new intergovernmental institution.
5. To demand/urge ASEAN to have a clear stand on CC mitigation based on historical responsibility principle.
6. Recognize the impact and potential contribution of all global citizens to the climate change agenda, we call upon all stakeholders: 1) Governments 2) private sector 3) civil society 4) academia 5) religious institutions and 6) individuals; to join us in efforts to ensure that human rights are placed at the heart of the CC agenda and act responsibility.
7. Place donor countries as stakeholders where appropriate and mention programmes need to be gender responsive from planning through evaluation
8. Include CC in the education system and school curricula.
9. Stronger statement/position for gender equality in CC negotiations, based on sound consultations and science.
10. Adapt and invest on cleaner energy technology.
11. Recognizing the important role of local government units in the implementation of gender sensitive programmes on CC and DRR.
12. Including indigenous knowledge systems and practices in the promotion of information on CC and DRR, and involve indigenous women and indigenous people in the implementation of CCA and DRR.
13. Recognizing the need to promote public awareness on CC and DRR complying gender sensitive approaches and to be initiated by the government, with the participation of all sectors (private sector, civil society, people's organization etc.)
14. Ensure women's participation in monitoring and evaluation of CCA and DRR
15. Increase awareness among women, capacity building of women
16. To acknowledge the need to work with the development sectors in responding to CC issues
17. Urge ASEAN members to be more active/pushy in implementing these agreements
18. Make an inventory, consolidate, and build regional cooperation among people's movements and NGOs working on gender-responsive CCA and DRR
19. To advocate for sustainable resource management policies and for review and change of policies, eg. mining, palm oil plantations, deforestation, logging
20. Consider conflict resolution processes in DRR and in reducing impact of CC
21. Involve rural sectors and other marginalized groups and have their voice heard while ensuring consultations with all stakeholders of CCA and DRR.
22. Allocation of budget for DRR and CC in addition to calamity fund and ensure monitoring of financing to address issue of corruption
